Ten days training program on One District One Product

Awantipora April 14: Ten days training program on One District One Product (ODOP) for Fruit and Vegetables for Horticulture Development Officers from Department of Horticulture and officers from Department of Horticulture, Planning & Marketing J & K was held w.e.f. 5th -14th April 2021 in Department of Food Technology IUST Awantipura. Six officers from Jammu division and twelve from Kashmir division were trained for the implementation of ODOP Scheme. During the training the trainees were exposed to food processing machinery and their functioning, product development, DPR formulation and Food Safety and Quality Control by the resource persons from food industry/IUST and SKUAST-K.

The program was inaugurated on the 5th of April 2021 with welcome note by Er.Tariq Ahmad Ganai. Dean Academic affairs Prof A.M.Shah highlighted the importance of industry viz-a-viz branding. Prof H R Naik Dean Research emphasized on continuous follow up of new industrial units to be established under ODOP scheme.
