The meeting was chaired by Prof. Ayaz Hasan Moon, Dean Academic Affairs, IUST, who welcomed all the members and expressed his gratitude for their presence. Dr. Arsheed Ganaie, Coordinator, Center for AYUSH Science provided a brief overview of the meeting agenda.

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Agenda Item 1

Agenda 1: To approve the introduction of multidisciplinary open electives in accordance with NEP-2020 at the Centre for AYUSH Science.

To act on the recommendations of the advisory council, the Centre for AYUSH Science proposes the introduction of a basic Open Elective program. This program aims to provide students with an opportunity to explore and deepen their understanding of ancient and traditional healthcare practices. The program seeks to foster a dynamic learning environment that encourages interdisciplinary engagement, and the exchange of ideas, contributing to the holistic development of students interested in AYUSH science.

This multidisciplinary Open Elective will be offered by the Centre for AYUSH Science in accordance with the NEP-2020. The modus operandi will be as follows:

Pedagogy: Pedagogy will be experiential, holistic, integrated, inquiry-driven, discovery centered discussion-based, flexible, and enjoyable.

Collaborative Learning: Course will be based on collaborative learning opportunities, such as grou projects or interdisciplinary seminars. These experiences can broaden students' perspective about th traditional knowledge

Critical Thinking: This OE course will be based on the NEP 2020 which emphasizes research on critical thinking skills.

Emphasis on Active Learning via Flipped Classroom: The NEP 2020 underscores the importance (active learning and critical thinking. We will deliver this course via flipped classroom model, when students will engage with content before class and participate in active discussions during class.

Recommendations: The committee recommended starting Open elective course at the Centre for AYUSH Science from the academic year 2024-25. The members recommended to devise a proper formative examination pattern for assessment of the students in the form of assignments, daily seminars etc. Weightage of formative assessment will be:

Agenda 2

To approve the syllabus for open elective course titled "Herbal Medicine in Healthcare".

The course syllabus is given in Annexure I.

Recommendations: The members suggested changing the title of the course from "Herbal Medicine in Healthcare" to "Natural Medicine in Healthcare". They further suggested replacing the 'course outcomes' with 'course objectives' in the syllabus.

It was also proposed that the title of Unit 1 to be changed to "Introduction of Indian System of Medicine", and a new separate chapter with the title "Integration of traditional with modern medicine" to be included. The members also suggested to change the title of Unit II from "Concept of Herbal Medicine" to "Principles of Natural Medicine", where the focus would be on treatment modalities in herbal medicine, six essentials of life, basic introduction temperaments in AYUSH. It was also suggested that practical demonstration of Yoga and visus to Hospital for learning regimenal therapies should be included in the unit.

Also, it was proposed that the title of unit III should be changed to "Natural Remedies for Various Diseases", with more stress to be given on preventive measures and natural remedies for non-communicable diseases &life style disorders like arthritis, anaemia, hypertension etc.

The members were of the opinion that a fourth Unit should be included in the syllabus "Integration of AYUSH with Modern Medicine" that will focus on the merits and demerits of traditional over modern medicine and the importance of integration of the of AYUSH with Modern medicine.

Agenda-3

Agenda 3: To approve the syllabus of the open elective (OE) course titled "Ethno botany of Medicinal Plants in J&K".

The proposed syllabus is given in Annexure II.

Recommendations: The members recommended changing the course title from "Ethno bouny of Medicinal Plants in J&K" to "Natural Remedies for Better Health." They suggested that the title should be modified to "Medicinal Plants of J&K", and a separate unit titled "Aromatic Plants and Their Uses" should be added. Additionally, they proposed inclusion of common Kashmiri medicinal plants along with their local names in Unit I.

The committee advised to replace Unit III, "Tribal Medicine," with "Aromatic Plants and Their Uses," focusing on common aromatic plants of J&K, their applications in the perfumery and cosmetic industries, and the role of aromatherapy in various mental disorders.

The members also recommended introduction of Unit IV, titled "Spiritual Healing". They suggested that the Centre should coordinate with the Centre for Spiritual Studies at IUST to devise a comprehensive syllabus.

The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks to all the attending members.
