A REPORT ON THE OBSERVANCE OF WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY 2025

The Syed Mantaqui Memorial College of Nursing and Medical Technology (SMMCN&MT), Islamic University of Science and Technology (IUST), observed World Mental Health Day 2025 on 23rd October 2025 with the theme "Access to Services: Mental Health in Catastrophes and Emergencies." The observance was held under the supervision of Community Connect Coordinator Ms. Mubashira Bashir, as part of the college's ongoing community outreach initiatives aimed at strengthening mental health awareness, service accessibility, and resilience in times of crisis.

The event encompassed a series of structured awareness and educational activities across PHC Aripal, Satura Anganwadi, and Gutroo community, targeting different population groups including children, adolescents, parents, and community elders.

The outreach programme featured the following key activities:

- Health education sessions on coping mechanisms during crises and disasters.
